## LAST SUNDAY OF THE CHURCH YEAR CHRIST THE KING SUNDAY November 20, 2022

**As We Gather** Jesus is what it's all about. As we recognize the Last Sunday of the Church Year, our Scripture readings remind us of what the Church, and our faith as Christians, is founded on---Christ Jesus and His cross. As the apostle Paul in today's Epistle puts it, "For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (*1 Corinthians 1:18*). Jesus' death on Good Friday truly is "the power of God," but it's not the end of the story of salvation. Also central to our faith is Jesus' death-defeating resurrection on Easter and His final victory on the Last Day. We proclaim this truth as we contemplate the hymn text,

The King shall come when morning dawns And light triumphant breaks,  
When beauty gilds the eastern hills And life to joy awakes.

Not as of old a little child, To bear and fight and die,  
But crowned with glory like the sun That lights the morning sky.

*LSB 348:1-2*

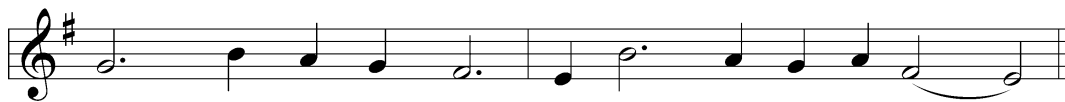
