CONFESSION and ABSOLUTION

Pastor: During this Advent season, as we prepare to celebrate our Lord's birth, let

us examine ourselves according to the prophetic revelation in Holy Scripture. Through Jeremiah, the prophet, God promises that the coming Massich will be called "The LODD in our right courses."

Messiah will be called "The LORD is our righteousness."

People: We confess that, at times, we consider our good intentions as

sufficient to somehow merit God's approval. We are sorry for not relying solely on the grace of God in Christ Jesus—the very source of

righteousness.

Pastor: In writing to the Thessalonians, St. Paul prays that our love for one another

may increasingly abound.

People: We confess that we have pursued our own interests. We have not properly looked out for the interest of others. We repent for not

expressing the love of Christ by using our resources to meet our

neighbors' needs.

Pastor: When Jesus enters Jerusalem, the crowd hails Him as their promised King.

People: We confess that we rebel against God's directives. We harbor our

secret faults, believing that we may escape His judgment or are unworthy of receiving His mercy. Our thoughts, words, and actions contradict the gracious rule of Christ the King. Heavenly Father, have mercy on us for the sake of Your only begotten Son, Jesus Christ, our

Lord.

(Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.)

Pastor: God the Father promised to send the Messiah—Jesus, our Righteousness,

—Jesus, our King, to be the chosen One, restoring us to Himself and declaring us to be His forgiven people. Through His sacred Word, God prepares us to witness His birth, His death, and His resurrection that the Kingdom of Heaven may be open to all believers forever. By your faith in the Savior who has come and will come again, all your sins have been forgiven

in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.


People: Amen. Savior of the nations, come, and open wide Your heavenly

From thence he will come to judge the living and the dead.


