THE TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD

February 19, 2023

As We Gather When Jesus shone in glory on the Mount of Transfiguration, the voice identified Him as God's only Son. What an eye-opening revelation of God's presence! It reminds us of God's awesome appearance to Moses and the elders on Mt. Sinai. Jesus is one with the Father and the Holy Spirit, the triune God. We need not go to any physical mountain to meet Him in a fearful display of His holiness. He is with us, to be heard wherever His Word is proclaimed and to be seen by faith in the sacraments administered by His direction. Through them He tells us, "Here I am." We rejoice to know His presence in grace, mercy, and forgiveness.

Attention Visitors We celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion this morning. This holy meal is intended for Christians who acknowledge their need of God's forgiveness in their lives. The Bible teaches that Christ's body and blood are received with the elements of bread and wine and that Christians need to examine themselves before receiving this holy meal. (1Cor. 10 & 11). This meal further expresses a unity of faith as we gather at one table to receive the assurance of God's forgiveness through the body and blood of our Lord in the sacrament. We welcome baptized Christians to commune with us, those who believe and confess this same faith and understanding of the sacrament and of the Christian life. If you prefer a gluten free wafer let Pastor know. Persons who desire to receive grape juice select from the darker glasses. If you have any further questions concerning the sacrament, please ask to speak to the Pastor. Hearing aids and large print bulletins are available. If you would



WE BID FAREWELL TO ALLELUIA

Because of the penitential character of the season of Lent, singing or saying the word "alleluia" has historically been suspended during Lent's forty days. The omission of alleluia during Lent goes back to at least the fifth century in the western church. The custom of actually bidding it farewell, however, developed in the Middle Ages. Our closing hymn is a translation of an 11th century Latin text that compares an alleluia-less Lent to the exile of the Israelites in Babylon. The text then anticipates the joy of Easter when glad alleluias will return in all their heavenly splendor.
