Fifth Sunday In Lent March 17, 2024

As We Gather Who does not know John 3:16? For God so loved the world, that He gave His only-begotten Son... Yet if we are to speak of God's love, we must speak of the cross. For it is on the cross that we bear witness to exactly what God's love looks like. "Christ was killed so that He might kill that which was killing us" goes an old Lenten phrase. Far from being a symbol of shame or defeat, the cross is our glory. Where we proclaim Jesus Christ and Him crucified, the love of God reclaims the lost from their sins and bestows upon them the life that death cannot overcome.

Attention Visitors We celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion this morning. This holy meal is intended for Christians who acknowledge their need of God's forgiveness in their lives. The Bible teaches that Christ's body and blood are received with the elements of bread and wine and that Christians need to examine themselves before receiving this holy meal. (1Cor. 10 & 11). This meal further expresses a unity of faith as we gather at one table to receive the assurance of God's forgiveness through the body and blood of our Lord in the sacrament. We welcome baptized Christians to commune with us, those who believe and confess this same faith and understanding of the sacrament and of the Christian life. Persons who desire to receive grape juice select from the darker glasses. If you have any further questions concerning the sacrament, please ask to speak to the Pastor.


THE WORDS OF OUR LORD






