THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT March 20, 2022

As We Gather So far this Lent we began by learning that Christ was tempted like each of us but did not sin, that He came to gather all sinners into the shelter of His grace but they were not willing to come, and now we hear of His mercy which calls even the unfruitful to repentance and new life. There is great hope expressed in these Lenten Gospels. Even more personally, we are assured that His grace is strong enough to sustain us against every fear, doubt, and temptation. Who among us has not wondered why harsh, grievous things happen and how much more we can bear? To all of these things, our Lord responds with mercy to keep us steadfast, with grace for daily repentance, and with hope in the moments of our greatest struggles.

Attention Visitors We celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion this morning. This holy meal is intended for Christians who acknowledge their need of God's forgiveness in their lives. The Bible teaches that Christ's body and blood are received with the elements of bread and wine and that Christians need to examine themselves before receiving this holy meal. (1Cor. 10 & 11). This meal further expresses a unity of faith as we gather at one table to receive the assurance of God's forgiveness through the body and blood of our Lord in the sacrament. We welcome baptized Christians to commune with us, those who believe and confess this same faith and understanding of the sacrament and of the Christian life. Persons who desire to receive grape juice select from the darker glasses. If you have any further questions concerning the sacrament, please ask to speak to the Pastor.
