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EIGHTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

July 31, 2022

As We Gather "Vanity and a striving after wind." That is what the Preacher calls everything done by people on earth (*Ecclesiastes 1:14*). One day, death will come to us all. Then what will we have to show for our lives---our earthly wealth and possessions? These will pass into the care of others. St. Paul reminds us that, "we brought nothing into the world, and we cannot take anything out of the world" (*1 Timothy 6:7*). The rich fool in the Gospel set his heart on the bountiful harvest of his crops, but failed to recognize the richer harvest of eternal life in God's kingdom. Rather than following this foolish example, St. Paul urges us to, "Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth" (*Colossians 3:2*). For the "things that are above" are the forgiveness, salvation, and life eternal that are freely given to all who trust in the Lord Jesus.

Attention Visitors We celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion this morning. This holy meal is intended for Christians who acknowledge their need of God's forgiveness in their lives. The Bible teaches that Christ's body and blood are received with the elements of bread and wine and that Christians need to examine themselves before receiving this holy meal. (*1Cor. 10 & 11*). This meal further expresses a unity of faith as we gather at one table to receive the assurance of God's forgiveness through the body and blood of our Lord in the sacrament. We welcome baptized Christians to commune with us, those who believe and confess this same faith and understanding of the sacrament and of the Christian life. Persons who desire to receive grape juice select from the darker glasses. If you have any further questions concerning the sacrament, please ask to speak to the Pastor.
