As We Gather Two strangers visited Abraham and Sarah. They welcomed the strangers and fed them. The strangers brought an amazing word of promise: Sarah, who had been childless, would bear a son within the year! Jesus visited the home of Mary and Martha, who welcomed Him—one, Martha, by serving and the other, Mary, by sitting at His feet and listening to His teaching. Jesus was God's Word of promise, in the flesh in their midst! Today, we gather in church and Jesus comes among us, as He promised, "where two or three are gathered in My name, there I am." Jesus is the Word that calms our worries. Jesus is the Word worth pausing to hear in our busy, rush-around lives. Jesus is the Word incarnate for us in His body and blood promising us forgiveness, life, and salvation. By His visiting us today, we are blessed!

Attention Visitors We celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion this morning. This holy meal is intended for Christians who acknowledge their need of God's forgiveness in their lives. The Bible teaches that Christ's body and blood are received with the elements of bread and wine and that Christians need to examine themselves before receiving this holy meal. (1Cor. 10 & 11). This meal further expresses a unity of faith as we gather at one table to receive the assurance of God's forgiveness through the body and blood of our Lord in the sacrament. We welcome baptized Christians to commune with us, those who believe and confess this same faith and understanding of the sacrament and of the Christian life.
