

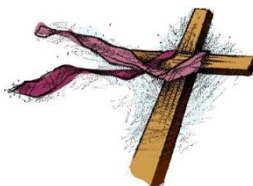

As We Gather Although the readings appointed for each Sunday vary on a three-year cycle, today's Gospel is read every year. It is a reminder that although we are weak in faith like Thomas at times, by the grace of God and the witness of Scripture, we are able to confess Jesus as "my Lord and my God." With that faith bestowed on us we are able to share it, as the disciples did on Pentecost (in the reading from Acts). We are telling others about "Him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by His blood" (*Revelation 1:5b*).

Grant us courage to use the opportunities You provide so that many may come to faith in our risen Lord.

Pastor: When Jesus appeared to the disciples on Easter evening He told them, "If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them" (*John 20:23a*). God promises to forgive the sins of all who come to Him in faith and repentance. For Jesus' sake God has removed your sins as far as the east is from the west and given you a fresh start. AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

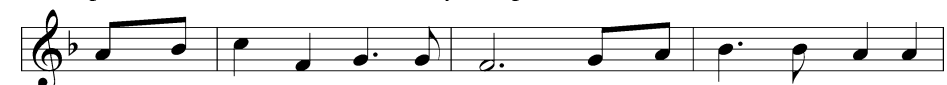
