FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT

April 3, 2022

As We Gather When our Lord entered time and space He was rejected, much as the son of the vineyard owner in the parable Jesus told. But by His death and resurrection Christ has become the cornerstone of the Church; in His infinite mercy He has opened our hearts so that we may know Him and the salvation He brings. It is the "new thing" the Lord promised through Isaiah and the surpassing worth for which St. Paul considered all else as worthless. In our Lenten journey today we focus on the great things God has done for us. (*Psalm 126:3*)

Attention Visitors We celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion this morning. This holy meal is intended for Christians who acknowledge their need of God's forgiveness in their lives. The Bible teaches that Christ's body and blood are received with the elements of bread and wine and that Christians need to examine themselves before receiving this holy meal. (1Cor. 10 & 11). This meal further expresses a unity of faith as we gather at one table to receive the assurance of God's forgiveness through the body and blood of our Lord in the sacrament. We welcome baptized Christians to commune with us, those who believe and confess this same faith and understanding of the sacrament and of the Christian life. Persons who desire to receive grape juice select from the darker glasses. If you have any further questions concerning the sacrament, please ask to speak to the Pastor.

Strengthen our faith and restore in us the desire to do all to the glory of the rejected stone who has become the cornerstone, Jesus Christ, our Lord.

He has done a new thing *(Isaiah 43:19)*
and given us "the righteousness from God that depends on faith." *(Philippians 3:9)*

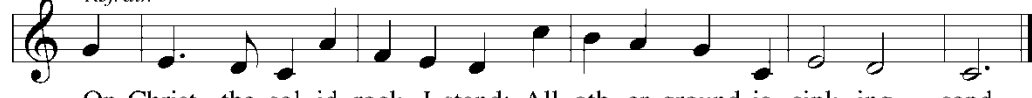



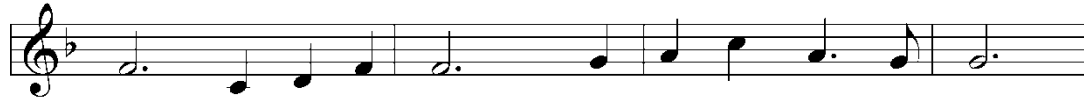
