**As We Gather**    Who are we and what can we do? We often lament that we do not seem to be up to the task before us. Today we are reminded that the God who gathers us to His Word also equips us with all that we need to carry His Word to the world around us. By hearing the Gospel today, we are being prepared to do the work of the Lord here in this place and, through our partnership with other congregations, throughout the world. We are not God's back-up plan but the primary means He has set up to bring the Good News of Jesus to all people and to display His saving glory to the whole world.

**Attention Visitors** We celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion this morning. This holy meal is intended for Christians who acknowledge their need of God's forgiveness in their lives. The Bible teaches that Christ's body and blood are received with the elements of bread and wine and that Christians need to examine themselves before receiving this holy meal. (1Cor. 10 & 11). This meal further expresses a unity of faith as we gather at one table to receive the assurance of God's forgiveness through the body and blood of our Lord in the sacrament. We welcome baptized Christians to commune with us, those who believe and confess this same faith and understanding of the sacrament and of the Christian life. Persons who desire to receive grape juice select from the darker glasses. If you have any further questions concerning the sacrament, please ask to speak to the Pastor.

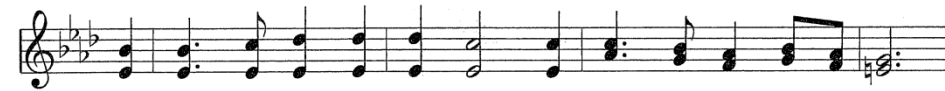

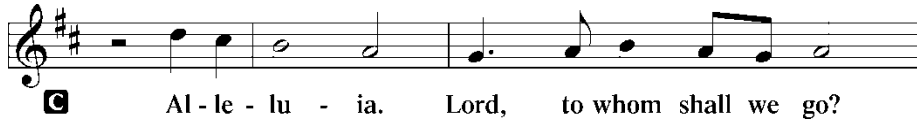


