SECOND SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY

January 17, 2021

As We Gather "You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body," writes St. Paul in today's Epistle.

(1 *Corinthians 6:19b-20*) The prophet Samuel was given to God by his parents as a child, and the disciple Philip brought his brother Nathanael to the Lord. We have been given faith to see Jesus (with Nathanael) as the Son of God, and the Holy Spirit uses our bodies as His temple (*1Corinthians 6:19a*). In response to hearing God's Word, the question, then, for us to answer - in the mirror at least - is, "What will you do with the body?"

Attention Visitors We celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion this morning. This holy meal is intended for Christians who acknowledge their need of God's forgiveness in their lives. The Bible teaches that Christ's body and blood are received with the elements of bread and wine and that Christians need to examine themselves before receiving this holy meal. (1Cor. 10 & 11). This meal further expresses a unity of faith as we gather at one table to receive the assurance of God's forgiveness through the body and blood of our Lord in the sacrament. We welcome baptized Christians to commune with us, those who believe and confess this same faith and understanding of the sacrament and of the Christian life. Persons who desire to receive grape juice select from the darker glasses. If you have any further questions concerning the sacrament, please ask to speak to the Pastor.






