As We Gather Over 2000 years ago, there was a group of ordinary shepherds outside watching their sheep just like they had done countless nights before. But, something different happened this night that would change the course of the world forever. An angel appeared to the shepherds to tell them that Jesus had been born. The shepherds rushed off to Bethlehem to see for themselves. Then, they shared "good news of great joy" with whoever would listen. We join the shepherds in that journey to the manger and out into the world with the life-changing message of God's love for the world in Jesus Christ.

Attention Visitors We celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion this morning. This holy meal is intended for Christians who acknowledge their need of God's forgiveness in their lives. The Bible teaches that Christ's body and blood are received with the elements of bread and wine and that Christians need to examine themselves before receiving this holy meal. (1Cor. 10 & 11). This meal further expresses a unity of faith as we gather at one table to receive the assurance of God's forgiveness through the body and blood of our Lord in the sacrament. We welcome baptized Christians to commune with us, those who believe and confess this same faith and understanding of the sacrament and of the Christian life. 




