THE TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD

February 14, 2021

As We Gather This day ends the Epiphany season and prepares us for Lent. Jesus has been revealing His true nature through His words and actions, and on the Mount of Transfiguration three disciples see His glory revealed as transfiguring light. Moses and Elijah appear with Him, talking about His departure in Jerusalem. But our Lord then commands the disciples not to tell about the event until after Easter. Because we live after His resurrection, Paul writes in the Epistle, we recognize Jesus’ true glory in going to the cross for us, for God has “shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ” (2 Corinthians 4:6).

Pastor: Our hope for daily and eternal forgiveness is secure in Jesus, for He who was transfigured is the One who was raised on the third day. Therefore, by your God-given faith in God's only begotten Son, crucified, died, and risen again, who is seated at the right hand of the Father, all your sins are forgiven. In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

WE BID FAREWELL TO ALLELUIA

*Because of the penitential character of the season of Lent, singing
or saying the word "alleluia" has historically been suspended during
Lent's forty days. The omission of alleluia during Lent goes back to
at least the fifth century in the western church. The custom of
actually bidding it farewell, however, developed in the Middle Ages.
Our closing hymn is a translation of an 11th century Latin text that
compares an alleluia-less Lent to the exile of the Israelites in
Babylon. The text then anticipates the joy of Easter when glad
alleluias will return in all their heavenly splendor.*
