SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

June 6, 2021

As We Gather Following our first parents, we have locked ourselves away from God in the prison of sin. We are held in bondage by the stinging accusations of the devil. From this prison it is impossible to escape. Yet Christ our Lord has entered the strong man's house and has bound him fast. Through His death on the cross, Jesus has born our sins away and set us free from sin's prison. This is the sure basis for both our inward renewal and our hope---hope of resurrection in His presence and of eternal glory in God's kingdom.

Attention Visitors We celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion this morning. This holy meal is intended for Christians who acknowledge their need of God's forgiveness in their lives. The Bible teaches that Christ's body and blood are received with the elements of bread and wine and that Christians need to examine themselves before receiving this holy meal. (1Cor.10 & 11). This meal further expresses a unity of faith as we gather at one table to receive the assurance of God's forgiveness through the body and blood of our Lord in the sacrament. We welcome baptized Christians to commune with us, those who believe and confess this same faith and understanding of the sacrament and of the Christian life.
