As We Gather When God provided something He called "bread" to His grumbling, complaining people in the wilderness, they asked, "Manna?" "What is it?" It didn't look like regular bread. But it filled their stomachs and stopped their bellyaching. When we pray, "Give us this day our daily bread," we, too, acknowledge that we receive more than just food for our bodies. As the psalm says it, the Lord "satisfies the desires of every living thing." Those desires include the deepest ones, the desire for deliverance from death and its cause, namely, sin. Even when we are all upset about the little things and don't see our greatest need, the God who saves us knows our need. His Son became the true bread that satisfies our true need for life.

Attention Visitors We celebrate the sacrament of Holy Communion this morning. This holy meal is intended for Christians who acknowledge their need of God's forgiveness in their lives. The Bible teaches that Christ's body and blood are received with the elements of bread and wine and that Christians need to examine themselves before receiving this holy meal. (1Cor. 10 & 11). This meal further expresses a unity of faith as we gather at one table to receive the assurance of God's forgiveness through the body and blood of our Lord in the sacrament. We welcome baptized Christians to commune with us, those who believe and confess this same faith and understanding of the sacrament and of the Christian life. Persons who desire to receive grape juice select from the darker glasses. If you have any further questions concerning the sacrament, please ask to speak to a Pastor.
