**As We Gather**    God’s people are always looking forward to surprising and wonderful signs of His presence and demonstrations of His power. Centuries before the coming of Christ, the prophet Isaiah confidently pointed to that time when miracles would abound for God’s people. In Jesus, the promise came to fulfillment as He touched the bodies and lives of many with His healing power and brought them strength and hope. As those who have experienced the power of God in our lives through the work of the Holy Spirit, we can find continuing encouragement. With strengthened hands, we can do the good works appointed for us.




